This site is a designated UNESCO World Heritage Site for its vast cultural importance as well as for having the largest collection of ancient wooden structures in the world, 980 in total. It's also the largest palace complex that remains standing in the world. You definitely don't want to miss the Palace Museum, which features an amazing art and collections of items from the Ming and Qing dynasties.

To escape the hectic city for a little bit, head to the Summer Palace, another UNESCO World Heritage Site. There are a whole 290 acres to discover, which is full of gorgeous temples, palaces, mansions, tea houses, and much more. This is a prime location to escape the busy city for a little and just appreciate the natural beauty of the park. There is a lot to explore, just like in the Forbidden City, so be ready for an adventure.
