Four Essential Military Gear For Off The Beaten Track Travel

If you are planning an outdoor excursion into the almost unknown or less trodden but challenging paths, you might want to think about correct gear that you know can take the beating. military gear or tactical gear is as tough as they come and is excellent for journeys which can reduce a grown man to tears.

There are 4 kinds of military gear which is important if you need to coarse it out in the great outdoors.

Military Backpacks

Army backpacks are the hardest backpacks around. They don't easily rip and they last a pretty long time. Actually I've been employing the same ones for 6 years now. The nicest thing about military backpacks is the compartment area. You can easily separate your stuff both inside and outside the back-pack.

Inside some military backpacks, you'll be able to find stretchable mesh pockets which are good for less lumpish items like documents. There are solid separators with flaps if you want to store items which need a little more care. Army backpacks aren't usually waterproof so store items you want to keep dry in a zip lock bag before placing them in these compartments. You could also stuff some silica gel to keep moisture at bay.

Outside the backpack, there are roughly quite a good number of pockets to store nibbles and LED torches and many more items which you need to access fast. If you've got a chest rig, it is more convenient to store those items there.

These backpacks also come with Mates webbing which allows you to attach pouches and certain items to the key back-pack easily. There are even specially made portable computer cases which you can stick to the head of the back-pack thru Friends webbing and secure straps.

Army or tactical backpacks also come in several sizes so you needn't lug around a mammoth back-pack for shorter trips.

Chest Rigs

Military chest rigs are great for storing items you want to access regularly or fast. You can fasten a walkie talkie and flash-lamp to the PALS webbing on the rig. In the pockets, you can keep a mini emergency kit, nibbles, power gels, batteries, small cameras and maps.

They also offer some protection when you fall forward. They do not come with airbags so don't rely too much on it for protection.

Hydration Packs

Hydration packs are great if you require more than a water bottle to quench your thirst. Just like backpacks, hydration systems come with different reservoir sizes to suit your wishes. Some systems come built into military backpacks while others can be added on to modular backpack designs.

LED Flashlights

Tactical LED flash-lamps are a must on any journey. These torches are typically weather and knock resistant. Some come with a 360 degree location light feature which essentially turns the flash-lamp into a lamp. For those that love spelunking or caving, head-mounted LED torches would be a great choice.

Buying Tips
