# **Lesson learned when bidding for 5 and 4 start at Las Vegas from Priceline**

I started bidding for 5 star Strip North at \$50 from 07/27 to 07/30, 2 rooms each night. Got rejected. So decided to add Strip South and add 4 star, changed bid to \$43, hoping to get Caesar's. Got accepted for Luxor. I checked other websites like hotels.com and tripadvisor.com, it is listed as a 3.5 and many negative comments and there is a mandatory \$15 per room per night resort fee. This is definitely a ripoff.

I called Priceline and spoke with two representative for ten minutes, cannot change or get a refund. I will try to see if can report to credit card as a fraud because "Name your price" claims to save up to 50% but on major websites and on its own website, the published rate is \$45 compared to \$43 of my bid. What a scam!

Lessons learned:

1. Do more research using Priceline's own website before changing the bid especially adding a lower star selection.
2. Always start with one night because if it is accepted,...
