One thing you can do on an international trip to make things easier is get your money exchanged before you depart. In some places, it can be difficult to get your money exchanged outside of regular business hours. Many large banks can sell you foreign money, so head there prior to going the airport.

Make sure you take along all important documents when you travel. Keep the copies of vital documents in a location separate from the ones you are taking with you on the trip. It is recommended to also leave copies of your documents with an emergency contact so that if the unexpected happens you have someone that has the necessary documentation to assist you.

Make sure that even your children are carrying some form of ID and emergency contact info. You should also make sure that they have some change on them in case they need to use a payphone. Parents should have in their possession current photos of their children with all of their vital statistics.

If you are planning a trip to a foreign country, the first step is to check their visa requirements. Some countries have an extensive process to grant visas. Apply for the appropriate visas long before your departure. This will help your trip go more smoothly, since without the right visas, you'll have trouble getting into some countries.

After your flight, try to stay calm if you find out that your luggage has not arrived at your destination. Ask any airport official where the lost luggage office is; have your documents from the flight and identification cards handy and fill out the appropriate paperwork. Most of the time, your baggage will be found and given back to you in short order.

When packing for a journey, consider choosing dark clothing, particularly for pants and dresses. By keeping your wardrobe on the darker side, you will more easily hide dirt and wrinkles, which are common components of travel. If you desire a more festive appearance, pair your dark clothing with some bright scarves, jewelry, or shoes.

They will direct you to someone who can start the appropriate paperwork. Be sure to have your travel documents handy for this. Generally, your luggage will show up, and you'll get it as quickly as possible.
